Re: 2006 Super Bowl XL Information

Wayne State University is thrilled to help with Super Bowl XL, which is on Sunday, Feb. 5, 2006, in Detroit.

WSU has been designated as an official Park and Ride location for Super Bowl activities (Motown Winter Blast, NFL Experience and all game-day events). Visitors can park at any of WSU's main campus parking lots for \$10 and take a shuttle to the above events Thursday, Feb. 2, through Sunday, Feb. 5. WSU students and employees enrolled in the parking program or those who use their OneCards to pay for parking will access their parking facilities as they usually do and pay regular OneCard rates. **Please note that if you are not enrolled in the parking program or do not pay with your OneCard, you will be charged the \$10 cash rate for these days.**

Thursday, Feb. 2, through Saturday, Feb. 4, the Park and Ride shuttle, provided by the Detroit Department of Transportation (DDOT), will pick up riders in front of structures #1 (Palmer), #2 (Manoogian), #5 (Anthony Wayne Drive), #6 (Welcome Center) and lot #50 (Matthaei). On Sunday, Feb. 5, the shuttle only will pick up at parking structure #6 (Welcome Center). Shuttle signs will be posted. Locations of actual stops are subject to change.

The Park and Ride shuttle will take riders south to the corner of Fort and Cass, where riders can walk to the People Mover or to any of the downtown venues, including the Motown Winter Blast. Please note that on Sunday, Feb. 5, due to the Super Bowl game, the shuttle pick-up/drop-off location will be moved to Woodward and Henry. Park and Ride shuttle hours are below:

3 p.m.–midnight Thursday, Feb. 2, 2006
10 a.m.–2 a.m. Friday, Feb. 3, 2006
10 a.m.–3 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 4, 2006
10 a.m.–3 a.m. Sunday, Feb. 5, 2006

The cost of the shuttle is \$2 per person each ride. An unlimited, all-inclusive, commemorative, daily shuttle pass will be available for \$7, or a four-day pass valid Feb. 2–5 will be available for \$20. Passes allow rides on any DDOT, SMART or TRANSIT WINDSOR buses, as well as the People Mover. Park and Ride shuttle passes will be available at the lower level of the Student Center Building (8 a.m.–8 p.m. Monday–Friday; 10 a.m.–4 p.m. Saturday) and at the WSU Barnes & Noble bookstore (9 a.m.–7 p.m. Monday–Thursday; 9 a.m.–6 p.m. Friday; and 10 a.m.–5 p.m. Sunday) at the corner of Cass and Warren beginning Tuesday, Jan. 24. Shuttle passes also will be available at various other DDOT, SMART and People Mover locations throughout Detroit. Purchase your shuttle pass early and save time!

Regular WSU parking times apply for all employees and students (<http://www.parking.wayne.edu/information.php>). WSU will open its parking to the public at these times:

- 6 p.m.–midnight Thursday, Feb. 2
- 3 p.m.–2 a.m. Friday, Feb. 3
- 10 a.m.–3 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 4
- 10 a.m.–3 a.m. Sunday, Feb. 5
